Installing a rain barrel or rain garden at your home lets you

- Protect our rivers and streams! Water stored in your rain barrel is water that won't run off into our streams. Instead, as you use the stored rainwater around the home and garden, it will absorb slowly into the ground replenishing groundwater supplies. By decreasing the storm runoff, rain barrels help moderate erosion and the reduce pollution in our lakes, rivers, and the Chesapeake Bay.
- Reduce flooding in your yard or basement! By collecting the water and using it for watering plants or slowly releasing it and allowing it to sink into the ground.
- Provide your plants with nourishing water! Unlike treated water, which contains chlorine and is "softened" with dissolved minerals, rain water is naturally soft and has no chlorine. The water stored in your rain barrel is better than municipal water for watering indoor or outdoor plants.
- Save money and water! Instead of water from the faucet, you can use water you've saved to keep your home landscape happy and growing. You'll reduce your water bill! And when there's a drought water restriction, use your own supply from your rain barrel.

Rain Barrel Programs
